

## CORRECTIONS

In the Review Article entitled “Deprescribing benzodiazepine receptor agonists taken for insomnia: a review and key messages from practice guidelines” published in the January 2019 issue (Lee JY, Farrell B, Holbrook AM. *Pol Arch Intern Med.* 2019; 129 (1): 43-49, doi:10.20 452/pamw.4391), on page 44, in the section entitled “Rationale for deprescribing benzodiazepine receptor agonists for insomnia”, wrong values for confidence intervals were provided. The sentence “Meta-analyses suggest that only 6 patients (95% CI, 6.7–62.9) need to be treated for 1 patient to experience an adverse drug event.” should have read “Meta-analyses suggest that only 6 patients (95% CI, 4.7–7.1) need to be treated for 1 patient to experience an adverse drug event.”

On the same page in the same section, a wrong value for odds ratio was provided. The sentence “Meta-analyses of randomized controlled trials (RCTs) estimate increased odds of daytime sedation of 3.82 (95% CI, 1.88–7.80) and odds of cognitive impairment of 3.78 (95% CI, 1.47–15.47) with benzodiazepines.” should have read “Meta-analyses of randomized controlled trials (RCTs) estimate increased odds of daytime sedation of 3.82 (95% CI, 1.88–7.80) and odds of cognitive impairment of 4 (95% CI, 1.47–15.47) with benzodiazepines.”
